Mr. Manninen was employed by the Finnish government to build and execute their National Bioeconomy Strategy. His presentation will focus on the parallels between Finland and New Brunswick, both forestry-based economies that have had to innovate in order to thrive. Finland implemented a bioeconomy strategy that transformed its natural resources sector, and ultimately led to increased economic growth. Finland's experience can serve as a model for New Brunswick's economic development and how our region can build a bioeconomy by cross-pollinating our traditional industries with transformative technologies.
